The global Covid-19 pandemic in 2020 saw a year that challenged everyone. Many Habitat families work in the sector we now call "frontline" such as hospitality, personal care homes and grocery stores. Many lost their jobs in the first wave. Thanks to the support of our donors and partners, we were able to help, such as providing mortgage relief until they found new jobs. We also adapted to ensure families in partnership continued their homeownership classes and their volunteer hours. As a result, Habitat families kept safe in their homes and we welcomed new famillies throughout 2020.

The pandemic proved the effectiveness of Habitat's unique home ownership model for helping families build strength, stability and independence for themselves. A larger number of longer-term Habitat families than we could have expected applied to graduate from Habitat housing to market housing. They had built independence for themselves and saw the pandemic as the opportunity to buy their first market home.

CREB® Realtors® Community Foundation continued its strong partnership with Habitat in 2020 including a Transformational Grant to refurbish one of the homes vacated by a graduating family.

As I reflect back on 2020 I feel much gratitude. Gratitude that our families, volunteers and staff stayed well through a year that saw many firsts and challenges. Our many partners staying strong in their commitment to help Habitat families. And thanks to CREB® REALTOR® Community Foundation and REALTORS®, new families and their children became homeowners in Silvercreek. Habitat's partnership with CREB® has been the catalyst to many heartwarming stories of families finding their path, and building a solid foundation in Calgary because they have found a home.

On other fronts, housing stability is high on the agenda for all levels of government, with a priority of further strengthening Calgary's real estate market to ensure all levels of housing needs are met. 2021 is shaping up to bring new optimism for our city and province.

volunteer update

Habitat's construction sites, including Silvercreek, were impacted by the COVID-19 related closures. As a result, the number of volunteers and community members who build with Habitat also dropped in 2020. Habitat eventually re-opened the site with AHS safety protocols in place such as limited numbers, distancing, sanitizing and masking. The focus however, enjoyed to opportunity help build a new home for a was on giving families the opportunity to complete their volunteer hours.

A number of organizations that participate in builds regularly made the difficult decision to pause their planned build days due to their companies' safety guidelines. On a postive note - a number of the organizations asked to defer their builds to 2021, allowing Habitat hold their funds until they are able to return. These organizations included the Health Sciences Association of Alberta, BASF, Power Properties, Aucerna, Appraisal Institute, Rife Resources and Gowling.

One organization- complying with all Government, AHS and their company's guidelines and in consultation with their employees - decided to proceed with their Build Day with very limited numbers. They reported having a successful day. Everyone - Habitat volunteers and staff, and the company's employees – all family and remained healthy.

We would like to thank CREB® REALTOR® Community Foundation members and board members who have continued their volunteering on site throughout 2020 as government and AHS health protocols permitted. We look forward to more "normal" times when Habitat is able to host more CREB® REALTOR® Community Foundation members, staff and board members again.

construction update







In a year where everything was a little different, our annual construction plans looked a little different as well. With the onset of COVID-19, our sites shut down around the first of March. Although our building was paused for some time, work resumed in June with a limited number of volunteers on site, with well-established COVID-19 safety protocols added to the daily site-safety protocols. Teams continue to work with that limited number on site in 2021.

What's new at the Silvercreek development?

- · **Silvercreek Building 1:** Possessions continued in 2020 and all 8 homes are now occupied!
- · Silvercreek Building 2: Our amazing construction crews finished the work on Building two in October and received occupancy permission just before Christmas. The community now has 10 more homes available for new homeowners.
- Silvercreek Building 3 & 4: These remain capped and are ready to frame. Starting the summer of 2021 we will begin construction on these buildings, which are scheduled to be complete in late 2022.

- **Sitework:** The development's parking stalls are in-place, with 45 stalls that include accessible and visitor parking available for Silvercreek residents and their guests.
- · Landscaping is complete, including the walking path to Nosehill Drive, which will be fully accessible once construction of all the Silver Creek units have been completed.
